Evershed Arrangements

Students are reminded of the arrangements for entering and exiting Evershed. In the morning students must enter via the gate nearest to Technology classroom, and then stay on the yard: Year 9 in your normal area, Year 8 to share the Year 7 playground. At break times Year 8 need to be on the top field at the bottom of the slope or in the LRC. If you are travelling to or from Linnell you need to enter the building via the Year 9 door. When leaving the site you need to exit via the Year 9 / Year 7 playground and then out through the gate by Technology classroom.

- Zero or one fixed term exclusions
- Fewer than 8 LOLOs in any behaviour block
- Not achieve -60 points in any block

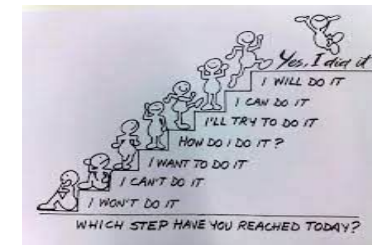
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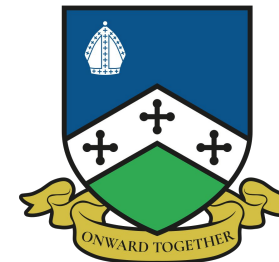


Ready to Learn

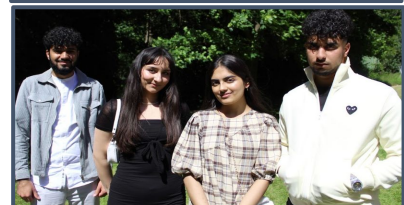
