Advanced Manufacturing Training Centre in Coventry

On Monday 27th June Archit, Amman and Deen are visiting the AMTC in Coventry for their graduation ceremony to be accredited with the Industrial Gold Cadet Award. They worked collaboratively with JCB to look at ways to lower the carbon footprint of JCB. They designed and devised a way to generate hydrogen for fuel cells from hydroelectric power using a disused quarry JCB owns in the Midlands. They produced research, costings and a model for a presentation they had to deliver (virtually) to a panel of judges. Look out for the pictures in next week's newsletter.


Our Year 7 team saw success from Jamie W in the Discus finishing 1st with a stonking personal best of 22.63m.

If you are looking for a new challenge, want to push yourself out of your comfort zone or boost your CV then this award is for you.


