Key Stage 4 Update

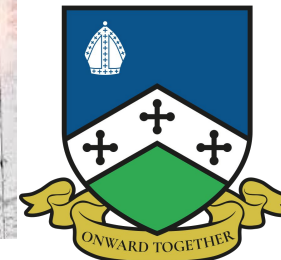

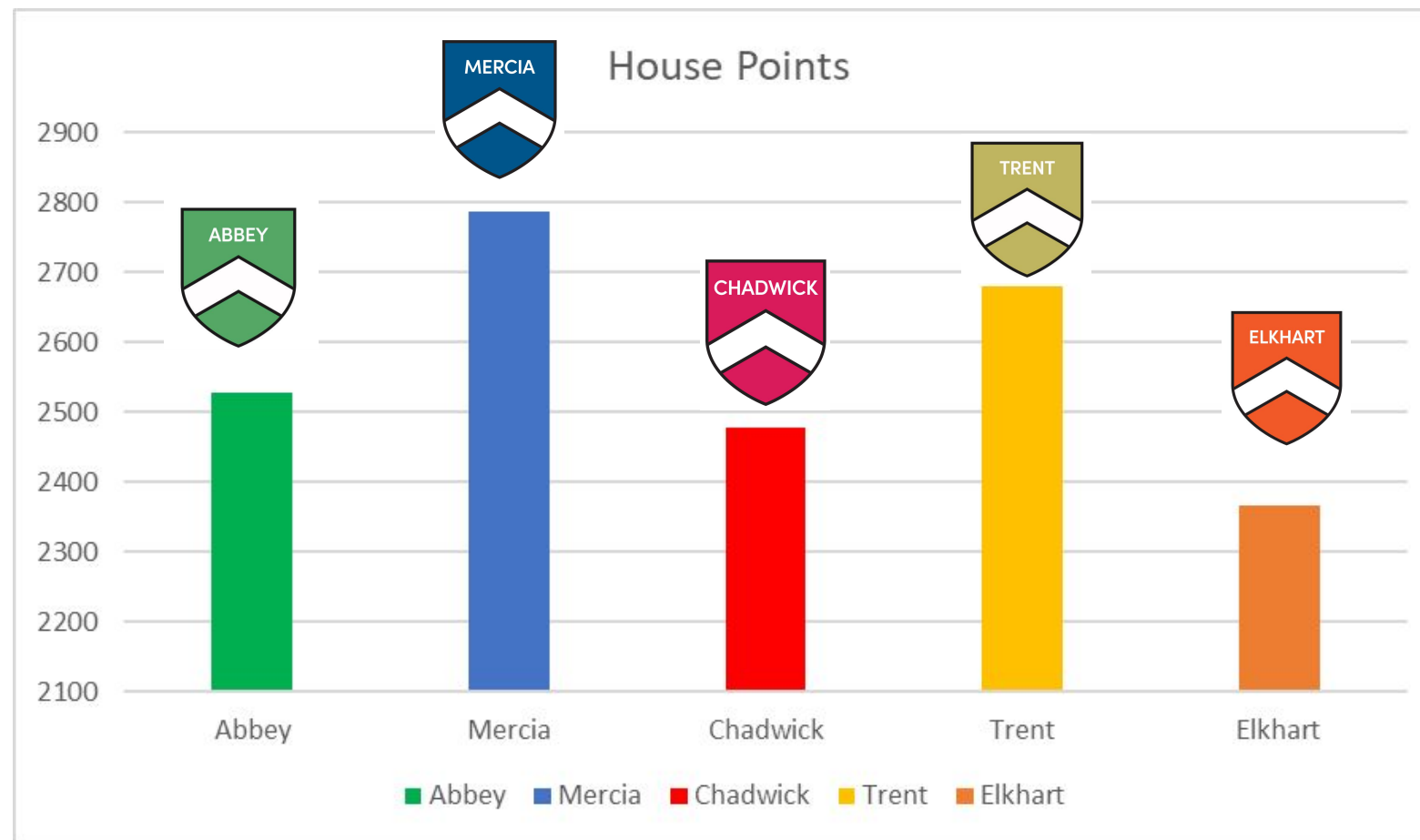
